Key Responsibilities

Teaching and Learning

- Design and implement developmentally appropriate, play-based learning experiences that align with the IB Primary Years Programme (PYP) framework.
- Foster a love of learning through creative, hands-on activities that encourage exploration, inquiry, and independence.
- Provide a balanced and integrated curriculum that nurtures early literacy, numeracy, physical development, and social-emotional skills.
- Observe, document, and assess children's progress using formative and summative assessment tools, informing future planning and reporting.

Collaboration and Communication

• Work closely with Early Years colleagues, Specialist Teacher and Assistant Teachers to plan and deliver a cohesive and enriching learning experience.

- Maintain regular, open communication with parents through meetings, reports, and informal channels to support each child's development.
- Participate actively in team meetings, planning sessions, and professional learning opportunities.
